For i-adjective predicates, “desu” である should be considered as the ending of the adjective’s polite present tense form. This is because in informal Japanese, the i-adjective can be used alone as a predicate meaning “is [adjective]”, so the base adjective effectively includes the meaning of “is” within itself.

The na-adjective is very simple to learn because it acts essentially like a noun. All the conjugation rules for both nouns and na-adjectives are the same.
