Appendix 4: The Universal Declaration of Human Rights

ALL human rights were violated - the right to life, liberty and property; the right to due process of law; the right not to be subjected to torture or inhuman and degrading treatment. People were moved around Europe against their will (abduction). These are the main human rights that were violated by the Nazis.

Preamble. Whereas recognition of the inherent dignity and of the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human family is the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world,. Whereas disregard and contempt for human rights have resulted in barbarous acts which have outraged the conscience of mankind, and the advent of a world in which human beings shall enjoy freedom of speech ...
