Human Papaya or papaya/pineapple enzyme tablets are both tasty to your rabbit and also helpful in preventing hairballs. One human tablet per five pounds of rabbit is the daily dose. You can also offer fresh (never canned) papaya or pineapple chunks if your rabbit will eat them a few times a week instead of the enzyme tablets.

How to Prevent Hairballs in Rabbits

True hairballs or furballs (technical term trichobezoar) consists of nearly 100% hair. In the rabbit, hair is mixed with stomach contents, food matter, in a loose mass. As this material dehydrates, the larger particles, including the hair accumulate in the stomach.

The term "hairball" has been used for decades to describe a syndrome in rabbits in which they stop eating, stop passing stool, and become bloated with gastrointestinal (GI) tract gas, fecal material, and dry mats of hair.
