Among the earliest Early Minoan pottery types is Incised Ware, characterized by incised decoration of parallel lines creating patterns on the surface of the clay. Contemporary with Incised Ware is Aghios Onouphrios Ware, a type simply painted with dark red or black diagonal lines, which form both series of parallel lines and criss-crosses on a light surface; these designs typically appear on jugs and bowls (2).
