Although Hardy conceived the idea of the novel much earlier, some sketches of The Well-Beloved can be found in the writer's diary in 1884 and 1889 (Florence Hardy 215, 285), he finally decided to publish it in book form almost a decade later when aestheticism began to permeate English fiction.
